LWR Kits

With school supplies going on sale, now is the time to help put together kits for LWR. Put the items in the quilting closet at the bottom of the front stairs when you bring them to the church. Bolded items are especially needed. The following are items needed to make one school kit and one baby care kit:

School Kits:

Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately

8" X 10¹/₂"; no loose-leaf paper

- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2 1/2" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Baby Care Kits:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 or 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

LCMC 20th Annual Gathering Delegates

LCMC 20th Annual Gathering will be held on Monday, October 5, 2020 at North Heights Lutheran Church in Arden Hills, MN. Yes, one day only this year. This is due to the current restrictions placed on group gatherings in the state of Minnesota due to COVID-19. Breakout sessions, fellowship and networking activities, and vendors have been canceled for this year. Registration is limited to 250 people at the gathering and is first come first serve, online only, and limited to voting delegates. *First Lutheran is allowed two voting delegates.* The deadline to register is September 30th. The event will be live streamed as usual, however this year they plan to offer a more interactive experience for those who will be "attending" the event from home. First Lutheran Church Updates as of July 1, 2020

Listening for the Promise WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Eighth Sunday after Pentecost-July 26, 2020

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." – Matthew 13:44 –

Jesus said that the kingdom of God is at hand, yet it has not yet come in its fullness. For now it is hidden, but one day it will be fully manifest. To express this complex reality, we say that God's kingdom is "both already and not yet." However, since this kingdom is also realized in time, perhaps we should say that it is "already, not yet, and coming."

God's kingdom is both costly and valuable. It costs us our entire lives, but it also gives us better lives in return. It gives us better lives by placing our daily work within a context of ultimate meaning and purpose, thereby ensuring that even our "mundane" work is eternally significant. In exchange for such value we should be willing to pay a commensurate price. As my grandfather once said to me, "Son, if you want good oats, you have to pay a good price, but if you want the oats that have already been through the horse, why they're a bit cheaper."

A parable uses an illustration to make a single point. Therefore, we should not unduly press the details of a parable. In our parable the man found the treasure, but we know that God is the one who finds us. In the parable the man hid and hoarded the treasure, but we know that we should proclaim and share the kingdom. In interpreting our parable, we don't press these details because they are not the main point. The main point is that the kingdom is hidden, costly, and valuable.

The kingdom is valuable because it gives us something to live for. It is not just fire insurance that keeps us from going to hell. It calls us forth to invest our lives in God's purpose in all that we do. Because the kingdom is a reign not a realm, it is not limited to the church. Rather, it is realized in every vocational sphere (family, church, state, workplace, and neighborhood) where God's rule is embraced. And for just this reason, it infuses every aspect of our lives with ultimate purpose and meaning.

Prayer: Father, use our lives to advance your kingdom in all that we do, in the precious name of Jesus, our Lord. Amen.
