Uphold your servants as they affirm the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth through this holy sacrament. We ask this in the name of Christ.

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL

 On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.



At approximately 10:45 am today we will have a special congregational meeting to vote on calling Charles Mann as our pastor as recommended by the call committee. All members are welcome. Only voting members (defined as confirmed members who have communed and made a contribution of record during the current or preceding calendar year) will have the privilege of voice and vote at this meeting. Materials for the meeting will be placed in the narthex prior to start of the meeting. These materials will include voter registration and ballot sheets, pens to be taken and retained by voters, and a draft Letter of Call for your review.

The purpose for this meeting is specific to the call of a pastor for First Lutheran Church, and will include the following two orders of business provided the requirements for a quorum are met:

- A vote by written ballot to approve placing a Letter of Call to candidate Charles Mann will be held (approval will require a 2/3 majority).
- If the candidate is approved, a second vote by sign to approve the salary and compensation to be included in the Letter of Call will be called (approval will require a simple majority).

LCMC 20th Annual Gathering Delegates

LCMC 20th Annual Gathering will be held on Monday, October 5, 2020 at North Heights Lutheran Church in Arden Hills, MN. Yes, one day only this year. This is due to the current restrictions placed on group gatherings in the state of Minnesota due to COVID-19. Breakout sessions, fellowship and networking activities, and vendors have been canceled for this year. Registration is limited to 250 people at the gathering and is first come first serve, online only, and limited to voting delegates. *First Lutheran is allowed two voting delegates.* The deadline to register is September 30th. The event will be live streamed as usual, however this year they plan to offer a more interactive experience for those who will be "attending" the event from home. If you are interested in being a delegate, please see Jeannette in the church office.

LWR Kits

With school supplies going on sale, now is the time to help put together kits for LWR. Put the items in the quilting closet at the bottom of the front stairs when you bring them to the church. Bolded items are especially needed. The following are items needed to make one school kit, one baby care kit and one personal care kit:

Personal Care Kits:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" & 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers, remove packaging

School Kits:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately
 - 8" X 101/2"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2 1/2" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Baby Care Kits:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 or 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

First Lutheran Church Updates as of August 5, 2020

No food to be served at this time or coffee hour.
- ➤ Doors will be open daily from 9:00 am 3:00 pm.
- Watch the church website, Facebook and notices on the church doors for further updates.
- We ask that you remember your tithing for the church. Either send your payment to the church or drop it off at Farmers Security Bank in Washburn notating it is a donation for First Lutheran Church if you will not be attending worship at the church.

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost - August 30, 2020

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.

- Matthew 16:24-25-

When I was very young (in 1974), there used to be commercials on television for the Prudential Insurance Company. The jingle went like this, "Get a piece of the rock!" They were selling an insurance that you could count on. It was rock solid. It was foundational to your well-being. In one of these commercials the narrator says, "This is Mr. Finnegan, he's seldom satisfied and often disappointed." Turns out though that Mr. Finnegan actually liked Prudential Life Insurance. He addresses the camera and says, "When I find something I like, I stick with it!" Cue the music once more, "Get a piece of the rock!"

Jesus told Peter, nicknamed "the rock," that He was going to have to suffer at the hands of men, be crucified, and on the third day rise. Peter didn't want to hear it. The "rock" on whom Jesus would build his church was now waffling. We humans do that, quite often, when it comes to suffering. We're not good at suffering. Jesus went on to explain that if any want to follow him they must be willing to take up their cross. Our cross is Jesus' cross. When we follow him we enter into situations where our faith is tried and tested. But no matter what happens, we put our trust in our sure and solid foundation which is Jesus. Peter may have been called "the rock," but Jesus is the boulder! Peter is more like a piece of THE Rock – Jesus.

Martin Luther said it this way in a sermon he gave on this text. He points us to the source of the real benefits, Jesus. "So now you might say, does not Christ say here, 'You are Peter,' and 'upon this rock I will build My church?' So you must understand that here Peter is called a rock and Christ is also a rock. For Christ is the whole rock and Peter a piece of the rock, just as surely as Christ. For what is attributed to us for the sake of our fellowship with Him is that we also have a Christian nature on us. He is good so we are also good. He is righteous and we also. Everything He has and can do we can also boast is ours."

So, we can get a piece of the rock (Peter) or we can get a piece of THE Rock (Jesus). And when we find something we like (that brings us salvation and a right relationship with God) we stick with it! Amen.
