As a gift of his love our Lord Jesus gave his church his Holy Supper and invited his own to receive this sacrament in faith for the forgiveness of their sins, as he said: Do this in remembrance of me. Now these young people have learned what Christ has done for them and the gift that is being offered them. They know what it means that they are sinners and need forgiveness. They know the joy of being loved and accepted by him. They are eager to say thank you by sharing the love they have received. Therefore, as members of the family they are now ready to receive the Lord's Supper.

To young people:

P Do you believe that in Holy Baptism God accepted you as his child?

Answer: I believe.

P Do you believe that you should share in the Lord's Supper with joy because in it Christ comes to you, forgives your sins, and strengthens you to trust him and to love one another?

Answer: I believe.

P You are about to be admitted to the Lord's Supper. The church invites and expects you to come regularly to the services of God's house to hear what he has to say to you and to thank him for everything. You will also have to continue to be taught so that you may better understand and live in the Christian faith. You will want to come to the Lord's Supper as often as you can. When you are old enough, you will be confirmed and take a more active part in the church and its work. All this will help you to live as God wants you to live as his own baptized child. So I ask you:

Do you promise to do this, knowing that God will help you? Answer: I do, with the help of God.

To congregation:

P You have heard the confession of these young people and the obligations they have accepted. God's whole family shares the concern and responsibility for helping them to grow up in Christ. On behalf of the church and of the young person's whom you serve as sponsors, will you help them to fulfill their promise?

Answer: We will, with the help of God.

P By the authority of the church, I now invite you young people to the Lord's Table to receive with us his gracious presence in this sacrament.

PSALM.....Psalm 27:1-9 The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? ² When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh, my adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall. ³ Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident. ⁴ One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple. ⁵ For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will conceal me under the cover of his tent; he will lift me high upon a rock. ⁶ And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me, and I will offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the Lord. ⁷ Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud; be gracious to me and answer me! ⁸ You have said, "Seek my face." 19... {F}or I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, 20 as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. ²²If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. ²⁵Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again. ²⁷Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ and not frightened in anything by your opponents. This is a clear sign to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God. ²⁹For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake, 30 engaged in the same conflict that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

GOSPEL READING Matthew 20:1-16 ¹{Jesus said,} "For the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ²After agreeing with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. 3And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, ⁴and to them he said, 'You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you.' 5So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. 6And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' ⁷They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the vineyard too.' 8And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last, up to the first.' 9And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. ¹⁰Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. 11 And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, 12 saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' 13But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? ¹⁴Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. ¹⁵Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' 16So the last will be first, and the first last."

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Pentecost 16 - September 20, 2020

But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong.

Did you not agree with me for a denarius?'

- Matthew 20:13 -

There are certain sermons that really stick with you over the long haul. We hear so many that it's hard to remember most of them, but once in awhile there's a message that gets through and sticks with us. This is the case for me with a sermon that was preached over twenty years ago on this parable.

I was working at a toxicology research laboratory right out of college, making \$7 an hour, which wasn't much even then! I wanted a job in the field of science because that was what my degree was in, but the job was very low paying. I knew I had to get experience in order to find something better later on, but I was young and newly married and we didn't have much money. I had an attitude about the pay which tainted my joy over the opportunity.

My pastor said something to the effect of "agreeing to a certain wage and being satisfied with that." It's hard when we think we are worth more than what we're paid, or when someone new comes in and you find out they are making more than you are and you've been there longer! Can you relate? This doesn't bode well for employee relations at all. Yet there was a truth to his words that I could not shake – I agreed to work for that \$7 an hour. I could have refused the job, and yet I needed to break into the industry somehow. An agreement is an agreement.

I think we can all relate to those first workers in Jesus' parable. They agreed to a certain wage, a fair day's pay, but when they found out that the boss has paid those who worked only one hour the very same wage they received for working a whole day, they were upset. The boss was right though! He didn't cheat them out of anything. He just happened to be very generous with those who showed up at the end of the day. It was his money to give, and those who fussed forgot that part. All of this touches on our sense of fairness and if we are honest, our sense of what we are worth. It also reminds us of God's great generosity and that without his love and mercy we would have nothing. We can never say that God is unfair to us – he gives us that which we do not deserve – forgiveness and new life. Amen.
