First Lutheran Church Update as of November 17, 2020 regarding Orders from ND Governor's Office and ND Dept. of Health:

As a religious organization, the FLC executive committee has reviewed the subject COVID 19 related materials, and in prayerful consideration we are moving forward with the following guidelines:

Church Services- in-person

- Facemasks will be required in accordance with the Governor's/State Health Officer's orders
 - Masks must be worn when entering or exiting the sanctuary. Please bring your own mask if able, if you do not have one available, the church will continue to provide disposable masks barring any supply/availability issues.
 - This does not apply to those who are exempt from ND health order, such as those with medical conditions, children 4 years old and under (children under 2 years old should never wear face coverings), etc.
- Social distancing will be observed, by family unit (maintaining six feet apart).
 - Pews will remain in usual position to allow for the most space per family unit
- Circumstances where mandatory face coverings may be temporarily removed (from state health officer order part 6) that are applicable to our services
 - Pastor Chuck (or others using mics up front) while socially distant in leading the service
 - Musicians to play instruments (as long as they are able to be socially distance)
 - While a family unit is sitting in the pew during the service when social distancing is possible

 After the service has finished, please fellowship outside for adequate space for social distancing.

Sunday School/Confirmation/Other small group activities held at the church

- All small groups are still welcome to meet
- Facemasks will be required when attending any of these activities at the church
- To accommodate more families to come see the Sunday School Christmas Program safely, we will be splitting the program into two separate programs with 20 minutes inbetween, more information on this coming soon!

All previous guidelines remain in place:

- Every family is encouraged to attend church, Sunday school, or other activities in the manner that <u>they feel</u> <u>most</u> comfortable (whether on-line or in person)
- Hand sanitizer is available at multiple locations within the church.
- No food is to be prepared in the kitchen at this time, and there will be no coffee hour.
- The FLC website (<u>www.flcwashburn.com</u>) and Facebook will be updated as we continue to monitor the situation and any new developments. Please check these sites for updates or concerns. If you do not see an answer to your concern, please feel free to reach out to Pastor Chuck or Jeannette.
- If you are joining online and would like the Sacrament of Holy Communion, please contact Pastor Chuck.

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Fourth Sunday in Advent - December 20, 2020

And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren.

For nothing will be impossible with God."

- Luke 1:30-37 -

During catechism class, as we were studying the Second Article of the Creed, we turned to this passage in Luke's Gospel. "What does it mean that St. Luke tells us that Mary was a virgin?" I asked the group of sixth through eighth graders.

"It means that she doesn't eat meat," answered Madyson.

After I wiped away the tears of joy and laughter at Madyson's innocence, I explained the real meaning of Mary's virginity.

Throughout biblical history there have been many, many miracles to ponder. The miraculous conception and birth of the Messiah is, however, one of the greatest (the greatest being the resurrction). We've heard the story of Isaac's birth to a barren Sarah and marveled at God's goodness. We know the similar story that accompanies this one, of John's conception and birth to aging and barren parents. But never had a virgin conceived and given birth! The meaning of this is that God would do whatever God had to do in order to bring salvation to a sinful humanity. Unable to live up to the Law, God provided the necessary grace in his one and only Son, Jesus.

To some, this story may sound like ancient mythology – a young maiden is visited by a god and becomes impregnated, giving birth to another god. It's easy to dismiss if we think of it that way. But we are talking about the one, true God here, not one of a mythical pantheon that helps explain war, tragedy, weather, etc. Our God is the God who fashioned the whole creation out of nothing (ex nihilo), and who breathed life into dust to make the first human. With God, nothing is impossible! Nothing!

This is good news for us on many levels! On a spiritual/salvation level – it is the answer to our sin. On a physical level, it means that God is capable of handling all our needs. Do we believe this news? Mary certainly did. Amen.
