FIRST READINGActs 4:32-25 (The unity of the Church finds its chief characteristic in giving testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus in preaching. The power of preaching comes from God — not the eloquence of an orator. Without great grace being upon this early community of Christians, the preaching would be ineffectual, little would have been shared with others, and they would have been a divided people, not the Church. God does wonders by his grace; we cannot do much without his good will toward us.)

³²Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common. ³³And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. ³⁴There was not a needy person among them, for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold ³⁵and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

PSALM (Read in unison).....Psalm 148 (Let all of creation praise its maker. This is only right, for first of all, creation owes the creator a debt of gratitude and praise for its being. More than that, this same creator God has raised up the horn of his people — that great delivering power who is God himself. (2 Samuel 22:1-2). The people who are near to him take refuge in his power, for he is a very strong fortress.) Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights! ² Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his hosts! ³ Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars! ⁴ Praise him, you highest heavens, and you waters above the heavens! ⁵ Let them praise the name of the Lord! For he commanded and they were created. ⁶ And he established them forever and ever; he gave a decree, and it shall not pass away. ⁷ Praise the Lord from the earth, you great sea creatures and all deeps, ⁸ fire and hail, snow and mist, stormy wind fulfilling his word! ⁹ Mountains and all hills. fruit trees and all cedars! ¹⁰ Beasts and all livestock, creeping things and flying birds! ¹¹ Kings of the earth and all peoples, princes and all rulers of the earth! ¹² Young men and maidens together, old men and children! ¹³ Let them praise the name of the Lord, for his name alone is exalted: his majesty is above earth and heaven. ¹⁴ He has raised up a horn for his people, praise for all his saints, for the people of Israel who are near to him. Praise the Lord!

SECOND READING1 John 1:1--2:2

(Here are the words that call us to confession. But what is it, besides the call itself, that compels us to confess? The Lord who calls us into fellowship with himself is all light. There is no absolutely no darkness in him. Therefore, if we claim to be his friends (John 15:15) but we practice darkness, we are discovered to be liars: "The truth is not in us." Consequently, all that we poor sinners can do, so that we are not participating in a pattern of darkness, is interrupt the darkness with light. Through confession, we shine light on what would be total darkness. We admit our sin so that we may be forgiven and cleansed. In confession, we receive the word of righteousness that forces out the unrighteousness and darkness that would otherwise be the only dark tone of our lives.)

¹That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life ----²the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us — ³that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. ⁵This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. ⁶If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 8If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

¹My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ²He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 20th chapter.

GOSPEL READINGJohn 20:19-31 (Imagine the wonder of that moment when the disciples were gathered together in fear, and Jesus appeared among them. He came to give them the thing they needed most in that hour: peace — his peace — himself. Then he sent them out to deliver his peace to others. He gave them his authority to forgive sins, an act which brings great peace. He also gave them the inspired word to write so that we may believe Jesus is the Christ and the Son of God. Now, imagine that he has just as much appeared to you through that written word. You, too, have been offered Christ and sent with his peace and forgiveness for others.)

¹⁹On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." ²⁴Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless

I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." ²⁶Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.





Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

April 11, 2021 — Easter 2

"...Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." – John 20:19b –

It is Easter evening. Jesus has been raised from the dead. He has broken forth from the tomb. A couple of the disciples were at the tomb previously and saw things firsthand. They came back to the other disciples and reported what they saw. However, the other disciples did not believe what they heard about Jesus rising from the dead. Perhaps this was just too good to be true? Maybe it was a reaction to grief? Just a crazy dream? It seemed way too strange to be believed.

Where are the disciples now? They are hunkered down behind closed doors hiding like frightened rabbits. They were the ones who had witnessed all of Jesus' work, his miracles, his very words and presence, and where are they? They are behind locked doors, gripped with fear. We know what death, defeat, and disappointment can do to us. We try some new venture and fail at it. When that happens, we become fearful and think that we just don't have what it takes to succeed. When a loved one dies we have a tendency to think, "What is going to become of me?" Death, disappointment, and defeat all lead to fear. The disciples are gripped by fear. They are thinking, "What will become of us? Will those same murderous authorities do to us as they did to Jesus? We hoped Jesus would free us from the tyranny of the Romans, but now look what has happened."

Now there is nothing left, only fear. And it was to these fearful disciples that Jesus shows up. He miraculously slips through the locked doors. He reassures them with, "Peace be with you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon them. How is it that these fearful, disheartened, disappointed disciples become courageous and empowered to proclaim the Good News to the whole world? Jesus. The risen Christ found a way to get through to them. He appeared to them, stood among them, and blessed them. These frightened followers were transformed into believing, active disciples.

You might be feeling fear and disappointment, but remember that when you are about to give up hope, you have a future. Whenever you are gripped with paralyzing fear, it's then that Jesus comes to you, reassures you, and breathes new life into you. That's our hope you see, that Jesus comes to us! Amen.

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
