



FIRST READINGActs 3:11-21 (We become either skeptical or excited when someone testifies to a miracle happening in his life. If we believe the assertion, we may say, "Praise the Lord," but our focus usually remains on the miracle instead of on the God behind the event. All miracles point to the great miracle of the resurrection. They are opportunities to declare the excellencies of God and call people to God, that they should turn back to him and have their sins blotted out. This is the true miracle of God: the resurrected Christ who forgives the sins of the world.)

¹¹While {the lame man who had been healed} clung to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astounded, ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's. ¹²And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: "Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. PSALM (Read responsively)Psalm 4 (The psalmist is annoyed by those who insist on troubling him. He urges them to change their ways, then wonders if they will ever act decently. By the end of the song, he leaves it to God, who has put joy in his heart when he might have only felt shame. He is able to sleep well, instead of laying awake troubled by his concerns.

Luther teaches little children to bless themselves each evening with the sign of the cross, kneel in prayer, and entrust themselves to God. He adds this comforting exhortation: "Then quickly lie down and sleep in peace." No less should be expected of adults. Entrust yourself and all your cares to God, then go to sleep in peace.)

GOSPEL READINGLuke 24:36-49 (We see two things foreshadowed in this reading. First, Jesus simply appears among the disciples in the same manner as he had disappeared in verse 31. He did not walk through a door; he simply was where he had not been the moment before. This is an example of the human body having been glorified. One day, when days are no more, "we shall all be changed," and the earthly existence may seem like an effortless dream as we live forever in glory.

Second, Jesus, who was just crucified and buried for our sins and the sins of his own disciples, says to them, "Peace to you." He is not angry. Nor is this a 1960s way of greeting his followers. Instead, he shows us by coming among them again and by his word "peace" that through his death and resurrection, concord has been restored between God and man.)

³⁶As {the disciples} were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" ³⁷But they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit. ³⁸And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹And while they still disbelieved for joy and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴²They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and he took it and ate before them. ⁴⁴Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, ⁴⁶and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, ⁴⁷and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."







WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

April 18, 2021 - Easter 3

"You are witnesses of these things." -Luke 24:48 -

Have you ever thought about being an Easter witness? That's a strange question to ask. There were no actual eye witnesses to the raising of the crucified Jesus from the dead just like there were witnesses in the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Unlike Lazarus, nobody actually saw Jesus stroll out of the open tomb. Yet, Jesus tells his disciples then, and his disciples today, that we are witnesses. We can sit alone and quiet for hours. We can take long walks alone in the forest or along the beach. We can delve into our own ego, but never, ever would we conceive and then come to the conclusion that God Almighty came to earth, was tortured, hung on a cross, and then rise from the dead and return to the very people who betrayed him.

The death and resurrection of Jesus is not a human idea. The death and resurrection of Jesus is a cataclysmic world event, something that happened outside of us and for us rather than within us. That's why we have to speak up and speak out. We have to tell the world that something has happened in the world, an event we did not devise: God has raised Jesus from the dead. That glorious event of the resurrection doesn't need anything from us to prove it. All that is needed now is to be a witness.

If we don't step up and become witnesses to the resurrection, how will people know the truth? How will they get the knowledge that death is not the last word, that evil is not the last word, and that there is hope in a hopeless situation, unless there is a witness to tell them?

The Easter message is not "natural." What is natural though is death, defeat, and hopelessness that comes when you think your future is over. Therefore, somebody has got to do something. Someone has got to love people enough to give them the good news that Jesus is alive, he is risen from the grave, never to die again!

Will you be a witness to what you have seen and heard on Easter? Will you testify to and point to the great victory that Jesus has won for us? There are people out there who are literally dying to get the good news. Will you be a witness?

Amen.
