PRELUDE AND BELLS

AS WE GATHER

(Some of the most memorable portraits of Jesus shared with us by the Gospel writers depict times when He prayed. We remember Him teaching the disciples to pray when He was on the mountain, sharing the heart of His teaching. We have the powerful portrait of Him praying in the Garden of Gethsemane the night He was betrayed. And in John's Gospel is recorded what is known as the High Priestly Prayer of our Lord. Jesus prayed for His people during His earthly ministry; He continues that praying for us. In his first epistle, John writes that "we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (1 John 2:1). There is holy conversation in heaven just as sure as there is holy conversation on earth when we pray!)

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: Christ is risen!

C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia.

P: Blessed are those who call on the strong name of the risen Lord!

As we gather in the victorious name of Christ, let us open our hearts to him and confess the ways in which we have failed to follow his will, and the ways in which we simply neglected our calling as his disciples.

(Silence for self-reflection and examination)

We have been redeemed and renewed by Christ, our Passover Lamb. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, + and of the Holy Spirit, let us walk in newness of life, following our Lord Jesus in holy obedience.



SALUTATION



P: Let us pray:

C: Blessed Trinity, your deep desire for you people is that we may be one as you are one. You have made us one in Christ through the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. Teach this gathering of Christ's followers to live each day out of our true identity —children of God and one in Christ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The apostles needed to replace errant Judas and they began with prayer — devoted, persistent prayer. Then they brought two candidates to God's attention, perhaps after a few interviews, and left it to him. They trusted God enough to direct the outcome, that they cast lots, turning over the decision to the Lord. Casting lots was a longstanding practice of the culture. Nevertheless, their cast for God's choice displayed great trust.)

¹²{The apostles} returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. ¹³And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. ¹⁴All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers. ¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about ¹²⁰) and

said, ¹⁶ Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. 17 For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." 18 (Now this man acquired a field with the reward of his wickedness, and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. ¹⁹And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their own language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) ²⁰"For it is written in the Book of Psalms, "May his camp become desolate, and let there be no one to dwell in it'; and "'Let another take his office.' 21So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²²beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us — one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." ²³And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

Blessed is the man

who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;

² but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night.

- ³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.
- ⁴ The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.
- ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous;
- ⁶ for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

You may know that you have eternal life if you have not denied the Spirit leading you to Christ. And you may know that you have eternal life if you have not denied the Spirit leading you back to Christ when you have sinned. Your sins will be forgiven and your eternal life assured only if you do not blaspheme the Holy Spirit by saying Jesus is not the Christ — or that he could not possibly forgive the likes of you.)

⁹If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 17th chapter.



The other way (the only way) to be a saint is through faith In God's word. In no way is this kind of saintliness determined by what we do. Instead, it is a matter of what (or who) we believe. We believe that Jesus has already cleansed us through his word (<u>John 15:3</u>). There is nothing we can add that makes a whit of difference.)

^{11b}{Jesus lifted up his eyes to heaven and said,} "Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I do not ask

that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth."





Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

May 16, 2021 — Seventh Sunday of Easter

"And they cast lots for them..."

- Acts 1:26 -

For the disciples of Jesus, the last few months of their lives have been a whirlwind. They witnessed the death of Jesus. They were filled with grief and became fearful. Then they were surprised later when Jesus rose from the dead and appeared to them, and they saw Jesus face-to-face.

After Jesus met with many of them sporadically, he ascended into heaven. The disciples stood gazing upward and they wondered what they'd just witnessed. The disciples begin planning their next steps. They are no longer confused or baffled. Now all of the disciples seem to "get it."

They needed to add a disciple to the group to replace the treacherous Judas. The number of them had to be restored to twelve. Two were brought forward, Justus and Matthias. The mundane workings of the church are now in progress. They have a discussion, a meeting, a brainstorming session. They say, "Well, since Jesus isn't really here now, we need to be practical about this. Let's just pick one and get on with it. We need to do our job and get moving!"

We think we may hear the voice of reason and feel the actual outcome is not really all that important, after all both men had been along for the ride since the beginning. But then Peter steps up and makes a speech about faith. So they pray and ask the Lord to guide them. Lots are cast in faith and Matthias is chosen.

What is important is the ability to be faithful in the decision, no matter the size or importance. This is the way to start out on the right foot, with faith first and foremost. These are the moments when our faith really shines, when we face a real test, not simply a tedious function of filing a report or forming a committee.

Peter was tasked with building the church. We are tasked with carrying the church forward. The church will persevere, regardless of us getting in the way. The real challenge for us and the church is this: can we be faithful? Can we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us?

The answer, of course, is a resounding YES!
