AS WE GATHER

(On this Holy Trinity Sunday, we do not so much explain God as confess Him. We testify to Him who has revealed Himself to us. To the mind in search of reasonable answers, God will always be a question or riddle to be solved. But to the empty heart, the Holy Spirit leads us to see with faith the God whose majesty has worked for our salvation and whose mercy has rescued us sinners from sin and the grave. Like Nicodemus of old, we want to know how, yet our Lord gives us not the how, but the who; not the explanation, but the mystery of mercy big enough to save us. We come today confessing with our fathers in faith the Athanasian Creed, singing "Holy, Holy, Holy," and rejoicing in the God who is bigger than we are, but who becomes one of us to save us.)

- P: Whoever wants to be saved should above all cling to the catholic faith.
- C: Whoever does not guard it whole and inviolable will doubtless perish eternally.
- P: Now this is the catholic faith: We worship one God in trinity, and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being.
- C: For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is still another, but the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.
- P: What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit.
- C: Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son, uncreated is the Spirit.
- P: The Father is infinite, the Son is infinite, the Holy Spirit is infinite;
- C: Eternal is the Father, eternal is the Son, eternal is the Spirit;
- P: And yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal, as there are not three who are uncreated and unlimited beings, but one who is uncreated and unlimited.
- C: Almighty is the Father, almighty is the Son, almighty is the Spirit, and yet there are not three almighty beings but one who is almighty.
- P: Thus the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God, and yet there are not three Gods but one God.
- C: Thus the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord, and yet there are not three Lords but one Lord.
- P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- C: And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY (Read in Unison)

Majestic Trinity, mystery of Three-in-One and One-in-Three, we worship you. Before time your love burst forth, creating the world in which you took delight. Strengthen us in our faith, defend us from all evil and temptation, and bring us into the everlasting presence of your love; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever. Amen.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE DAY

P: Today is Holy Trinity, the First Sunday after Pentecost. The festival half of the Church Year, which has confessed the saving events in the life of our Lord, now gives way to that part of the Church Year in which we hear His teaching. From the Old Testament Reading from Isaiah, we witness a glimpse of the glory of the Lord, the God of Sabaoth, whose power is chiefly known in showing mercy. In the Epistle from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear another part of the Pentecost sermon of Peter attesting to the revelation of Jesus as both Lord and Christ. In the Gospel according to John, we hear Jesus' conversation with Nicodemus and within this we hear the most beloved and familiar verse of Scripture.

FIRST READINGIsaiah 6:1-8

(Before noting the Trinitarian allusions, observe the magnificence of God. The train of his royal robe is so large that it fills the entire temple. This is reminiscent of God's greatness being so massive that the header on the already huge temple doors must be lifted away before he can enter (<u>Psa 24:7-10</u>).

Though we are meant to focus on God's glory — even his Trinitarian nature — in this pericope, it is difficult not to stare for a moment at the seraph. He does not have two wings, as one might expect. Instead, this fiery attendant of God has three sets of wings. The seraphim call out to each other in triplets, "Holy! Holy! Holy!" God puts out a call for an earthly messenger, asking, "Who will go for us?" — showing the plural oneness of God. The triune allusions indicate that the plurality is a singular Trinity.)

¹In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet. and with two he flew. ³And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" ⁴And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost: for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" ⁶Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." 8And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

PSALM (Read responsively)Psalm 29 (Luther thinks that this psalm is a prophecy of God's word and promise joining with the water of baptism. How can we disagree? His voice is indeed over those waters, too — and must be, or it is not baptism. God's Spirit hovered over the dark waters in the beginning, creating order where there had been chaos. Now the Father's Holy Spirit joins with the word of Christ to regenerate sinners.)

Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength. ² Ascribe to the Lord the alory due his name: worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness. ³ The voice of the Lord is over the waters: the God of glory thunders, the Lord, over many waters. ⁴ The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty. ⁵ The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon. ⁶ He makes Lebanon to skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox. ⁷ The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire. ⁸ The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness: the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh. ⁹ The voice of the Lord makes the deer give birth and strips the forests bare. and in his temple all cry, "Glory!" ¹⁰ The Lord sits enthroned over the flood: the Lord sits enthroned as king forever. ¹¹ May the Lord give strength to his people! May the Lord bless his people with peace! SECOND READINGActs 2:14a, 22-36 (Although Jesus was in the very form of God (Philippians 2:6), he was a man, too. He is God incarnate or God in flesh, and he did not use his divine nature as a way to draw honor to himself.

He embraced his human nature for our sake. But now the Lord has been exalted at the right hand of God. God has bestowed upon him a name that is above every other name. Since God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ, the one we crucified is now enthroned with the Father and his Spirit, forever one God over heaven and earth.) ^{14a}Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them:

²²"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know — ²³this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. ²⁴God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. ²⁵For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; ²⁶therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. ²⁷For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption. ²⁸You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of aladness with your presence.' ²⁹Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. ³⁰Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, ³¹he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. ³²This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. ³³Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. ³⁴For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, 'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, ³⁵until I make your enemies your footstool.' ³⁶Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

- C: Alleluia, Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia. Alleluia.
- P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 3rd chapter.

GOSPEL READINGJohn 3:1-17

(In this lesson, we see all three persons of the Trinity on display. The Father, often referred to as simply God in these closely linked Trinitarian passages, the Son, and the Spirit are each named in this critical passage about salvation. Here we see the law personified in a Pharisee challenged by grace personified, of course, in Jesus.

Nicodemus visited Jesus by cover of night, as though secretly, and wanted to chat. At this stage his motives were unclear, but he did admit that it was obvious Jesus came from God. As though to say, "That's nice, Nick, but I am God," Jesus called himself the "Son of Man." Jesus referred to himself as the "Son of Man" 84 times in the gospels. It is a title that indicates his divinity. What he said next engaged the Pharisee with the authority of God. Cutting to the point, Jesus told Nicodemus what he really needed to hear: "You must be born again.")

¹There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ²This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." ³Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. ⁶That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' 8The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? ¹¹Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but vou do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son

of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

- P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- C: Praise to you, O Christ.

SERMON Pastor Chuck Mann

THE ATHANASIAN CREED AS A LITANY OF FAITH (Part 2)

- P: As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so catholic religion forbids us to say that there are three gods or three lords.
- C: The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten;
- P: The Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten by the Father.
- C: The Spirit was neither made nor created, but is proceeding from the Father and the Son.
- P: Thus there is one Father and not three fathers, one Son and not three sons, one Holy Spirit and not three spirits.
- C: And in this Trinity, no one is before or after, greater or less than the other,
- P: But all three persons are in themselves coeternal and coequal, and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three persons.
- C: Whoever wants to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

THE ATHANASIAN CREED AS A LITANY OF FAITH (Part 3)

- P: It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe that our Lord Jesus Christ became flesh,
- C: For this is the true faith that we believe and confess: that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man:
- P: He is God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father,
- C: And he is man, born in the world from the being of his mother, existing fully as God and fully as man, with rational soul and a human body,
- P: Equal to the Father in divinity and subordinate to the Father in humanity.
- C: Although he is God and man, he is not divided but is one Christ: He is united because God has taken humanity into himself; he does not transform deity into humanity.
- P: He is completely one, in the unity of his person, without confusing his natures.

- C: For as the rational soul and body are one person, so the one Christ is God and man.
- P: He suffered for our salvation.
- C: He descended into hell, and rose again from the dead.
- P: He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
- C: He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- P: At his coming, all people shall rise bodily to give an account of their own deeds.
- C: Those who have done good will enter eternal life, and those who have done evil will enter eternal fire.
- P: This is the catholic faith.
- C: One cannot be saved without believing this firmly and faithfully.


