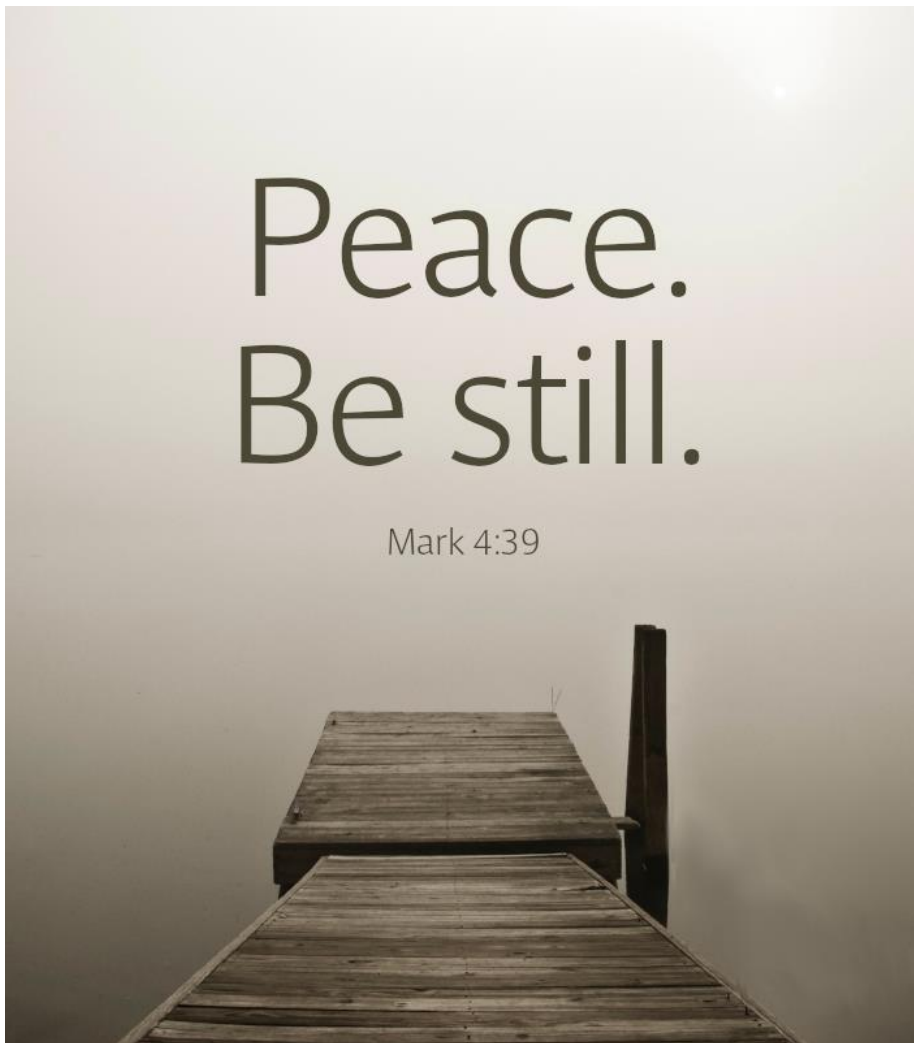

*(In today's Gospel, Jesus commands the wind and the sea to become calm, which understandably stuns the disciples. "Who is this?" they wonder. The other Readings today reaffirm that we know that Jesus is one person of the Holy Trinity. The Creator puts creature Job in his place. We also ought to remember with whom we are dealing when we request or complain. Paul encourages his readers, then and now, to put their circumstances into the context of the whole Church. Our situations do not define us! Sure of God's care and emboldened by the strength He provides, we are called to live out our faith confidently. We know who this is: He is Jesus, our Savior.)*

FIRST READING ..... Job 38:1-11

*(No matter the assault suffered, God is in the breach. We often think life — or even God — unfair when suffering the death of a loved one, illness, loss of income, or any other trouble. Though we complain and blame, God remains with us as he continued to be with Job. It may not feel like he is with us, but in the end, when our lament has run out, we sense his control of our lives.)*

<sup>1</sup>The Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: <sup>2</sup>“Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? <sup>3</sup>Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. <sup>4</sup>Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. <sup>5</sup>Who determined its measurements — surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? <sup>6</sup>On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, <sup>7</sup>when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? <sup>8</sup>Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, <sup>9</sup>when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, <sup>10</sup>and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, <sup>11</sup>and said, ‘Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed’?”

PSALM (Read responsively) ..... Psalm 124

*(Our enemies are many and our friends too few. If the Lord were not so faithful, always on our side, how could we withstand the flood of life? Much of what we endure is commonplace and fairly tame, yet the God of all creation, “Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible,” stands by us in the little things and the large alike. He is our help in every storm.)*

If it had not been the Lord who was on our side—  
let Israel now say—

SECOND READING ..... 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

*(The apostles suffered much and their faithful conduct in the face of tribulation is commendable. Obviously, Paul was suffering in his relations with the Corinthian Church. This is pretty standard fare. Some church folks find fault with ministers of the gospel and some in the world find fault with Christians. Paul and the other apostles had suffered a great deal for the gospel, and now Paul was even enduring trials from the Corinthian Christians.)*

*Paul did not turn against them, but instead, opened his heart all the wider to them. He did not lash out but spoke the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15), hoping that the Corinthians would return his affections.)*

<sup>1</sup>Working together with {Christ}, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. <sup>2</sup>For he says, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. <sup>3</sup>We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, <sup>4</sup>but as servants of God we

commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, <sup>5</sup>beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; <sup>6</sup>by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; <sup>7</sup>by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; <sup>8</sup>through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; <sup>9</sup>as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; <sup>10</sup>as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything. <sup>11</sup>We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open. <sup>12</sup>You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. <sup>13</sup>In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.

## GOSPEL READING .....Mark 4:35-41

*(In traveling from one side of the Sea of Galilee to the other, the disciples were headed away from comfortable Jewish culture to one of the Gentiles and religious practices that threatened their composure. Somewhere in their journey to the eastern shore, a storm arose during the dark of night. One cannot fault the disciples; the situation was desperate. The boat was being swamped. Jesus was sleeping through the storm, so his disciples woke him. He spoke a commanding word of peace to the storm and it was still upon the lake.)*

*Next, he admonished the disciples for their evident lack of faith. Perhaps this is the reason Mark used a word that means “to go through” when Jesus said they were to head to the other side of the lake. English translations say “pass over,” (KJV) “go over,” (ASV), and “go across” (RSV, ESV, LEB). Even the very literal NASB reads, “go over.” Though they were going across the sea, they needed to pass through their fears and prevail by faith before they would minister in mysterious and frightening cultures and countries.)*

<sup>35</sup>On that day, when evening had come, {Jesus} said to {the disciples}, “Let us go across to the other side.” <sup>36</sup>And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. <sup>37</sup>And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. <sup>38</sup>But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” <sup>39</sup>And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, “Peace! Be still!” And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. <sup>40</sup>He said to them, “Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?” <sup>41</sup>And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, “Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?”
