

The summer has come and break from school is here and the sun is shining (well, most days). This month we celebrate the day of Pentecost and the giving of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost also marks the beginning of the longest season in the church year. We can also look forward to our time worshipping with our neighbors and fellow Christians at Fahlgren Park during Riverboat days.

A good question for the start of summer could be: How can we **thrive** this summer instead of just *survive*?

The above passage from the book of Acts is a perfect reminder as we look to our summer schedules and time away from our normal routines to remember what we are about. This passage is from the Book of Acts that describes the early church and what they devoted themselves to: apostles' teaching about Jesus, fellowship in eating with one another and prayers. These were the norms of the faith community.

Two essential items that can help you thrive this summer:

- 1. **5-minute challenge** add a devotional time to your summer schedule or increase your time in God's Word. This is an easy way to have fellowship with God. To seek Him out, to love and serve Him. Set a timer for 3 minutes and pick a chapter or Psalm in the Bible and read until the timer is done. Then pray and reflect to God what you heard Him say in Scripture for the remaining 2 minutes.
- 2. Right Fellowship Fellowship is sharing life with those who are followers of Jesus. It's not a coincidence that the major periods of spiritual growth in our lives are often also times of rich Christian fellowship. We hear this echoed in our passage above. The time together was so important for their continued growth and spiritual health. Like the early Christians, we need to make sure our worship and fellowship stay a priority in our busy summer schedules.

The Church Council met on May 19, 2022, at 6:30 PM. Present were: Matt Gardner, Aaron Solomonson, Mac Beaudry, Pastor Mann, Julie Bentz, Sarah Kadrmas, and Janet Hanson. Absent were Melanie Beckmann, Lee Kugler, and Jeff Schmidt. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order.

Pastor led with devotions on "What is Love?" based on Matt. 22: 37-40 as presented by Rev. Mark Vander Tuig.

Beaudry/Kadrmas to approve the minutes from April 19, 2022. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$120,789.26; Building: \$32,681.01; Cemetery: \$617.40; Interest: \$8,757.18; Music: \$1,221.74; Parking Lot: \$630.00; Worship: \$2,703.44; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$329,392.43. Bentz/Beaudry to approve the report for future audit and to pay all nonbudgeted bills. Carried.

Pastors Report: Pastor mentioned he received many good comments on the Music Ministry service that was held last week. He continues with visitation with staff and members through home and phone visits. There will be another second service open discussion on May 21 at 6:00 pm. Sharing Faith will begin on Tuesday June 14. Pastor will be using vacation to complete the final NALC Clergy materials on May 23 - May 30. He will be gone July 11 - 25 for vacation.

Committee reports:

Worship: Schmidt was absent, but Rost reported the worship/music schedule is done through Aug. Education: Last Sunday was the last day for Sunday school. They are now gearing up for Bible School.

Old Business:

Gardner said there will be more discussion next month on the Endowment Fund policy. Council is to read the draft and either let Gardner know of concerns/ideas before the next meeting, or else we will discuss it at our next meeting. Mutual Ministry: The committee has come up with a job description for the Coordinator of Student Ministries (former Youth director). Solomonson/ Kadrmas to approve the job description. Carried. The job will be advertised in different papers/ sites.

Work on the parsonage basement bathroom has been started.

Discussion was held on cabinets in the Sunday school storage room. Kadrmas/Bentz to approve the bid from Roughrider Industries for Sunday School/Office storage cabinets for \$5,607.00. When Roughrider Industries was here, they looked at the space in the hallway by the phone downstairs. Hanson/Solomonson to accept the bid from Roughrider for storage cabinets in the kitchen area, less the coat rack proposal, with separate locks on the cabinets. Carried.

Church clean up went well. We got rid of some items that we no longer need. Anything that is left will be brought to donation sites or put on the curb for pickup. Gardner will be working on this tomorrow and he will accept any help from anyone who can help around noon.

The property use policy will be tabled to June.

No one has come up to the challenge to have a float for Riverboat days. Kadrmas will check with someone who expressed some interest to see if they want to head it up.

New Business:

Beaudry/Solomonson to donate \$75.00 to the Sheriff's Department National Child Safety Council. Carried.

The LCMC annual gathering and convention is Oct. 2-5. Early registration is due Aug. 15 for anyone interested in attending.

The annual July picnic will be held on July 6.

Donna Gunderson expressed interest in being a decorator for the Church. Beaudry/Kadrmas moved for the Mutual Ministry committee to discuss this and Gardner will contact Gunderson to inform her of this decision. Carried.

Jason Thoms from Dakota Pro Musica asked if the Church would be interested in hosting a Veterans Concert titled "War, Peace, and Freedom on Sunday, Nov. 6. Beaudry/Hanson to approve this request. Carried

The tech committee talked about using the screen more during worship. They discussed they will put Church announcements on the screen before church. The worship committee may have to take over the screen use portion of the service in the future.

We got quotes form Tricorne Audio, Inc. for audio upgrades and repair what we have. Beaudry/ Solomonson to approve the quote for the repairs/ upgrades to the cost of \$2,410.00.

Updates to Rost's computer plus the laptop used in the Church will be made. The cost of \$1,714.00

will be just for parts with the rebuilding/repairing labor being donated.

There were no transfers in.


Kadrmas/Bentz to approve the transfer of Justin Petersen to Bethel Lutheran Church in Greenbush, MN. Carried.

I would like to start out by thanking everyone that was able to take time out of their busy day to help us make bracelets for bereaved parents. It was an amazingly creative bunch, and I am excited to hopefully host this event again in the future for those that missed. The support that was felt means the world to me and I appreciate all of you.



Ways to provide support for someone you know whose baby died, had a miscarriage, stillbirth, or are facing infertility.

- Don't be afraid to talk/ask questions about the baby/infertility journey.
- Try to remember important dates to them (birthdays, due dates, etc.).
- Grieve and be sad with them.
- Be a listening ear, even if you don't have any words to say.
- Check in on the non-birthing partner too!
- Don't be afraid to mention the baby's name in conversation.

"You're so strong."

A phrase that I hear quite often, and it has made me feel like a phony since some days I feel anything but that. This statement is the perfect opportunity for me to point others to Christ. My prayer is that His strength will shine through me and my broken vessel will encourage and inspire those that are also broken and hurting. I surrender everything to Christ and rest knowing His spirit will continue to guide me. As believers we know that our true source of strength and comfort is Jesus.

"Everything happens for a reason."

I have to touch on this very popular phrase that I am guilty of using before losing Isaac. It is one that I have a hard time with. It is genuinely tossed at grievers to bring them comfort and encouragement, but I feel like it just complicates our thoughts with its complexity. This phrase triggers my grief/trauma in a negative way and I pray that with time it will ease. There are so many tragedies of this world that are far beyond our understanding.

"Suffering Happens: because the world is not as it should be God weeps with us, all while working the most terrible things together for our good. May we mourn over the things that break God's heart too, such as sin, death and brokenness." (Sunlight in December)

"And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good. For those who are called according to his purpose." ~ Romans 1:21

A huge part of my grieving process has taught me to have forgiveness and lots of grace to all those who are trying to provide comfort. Seeing past the words and feeling the grace behind them.

I will end with one more quote from the book called: And Still She Laughs.

"As each day without Daisy goes by, a choice lies before me. Shall I agree with God and move forward? Or shall I live in denial, stubbornly unable to receive blessings or be a blessing?"





CELEBRATING THE CHURCH'S BIRTHDAY

On Pentecost, we remember when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples. As they gathered in Jerusalem 10 days after Jesus' ascension, they saw tongues of fire, heard rushing wind



and began speaking in many languages. Because the disciples could then share the good news with all the pilgrims assembled for the Pentecost festival, the occasion marks the birthday of the Christian church. That day alone, about 3,000 people devoted their lives to Christ.

Like the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is important and relevant today. As theologian Henri Nouwen writes, "Without Pentecost the Christ-event - the life, death and resurrection of Jesus - remains imprisoned in history as something to remember, think about and reflect on. The Spirit of Jesus comes to dwell within us, so that we can become living Christs here and now."




