<sup>3</sup> So Jesus told them this story: <sup>4</sup>"If a man has a hundred sheep and one of them gets lost, what will he do? Won't he leave the ninety-nine others in the wilderness and go to search for the one that is lost until he finds it? <sup>5</sup>And when he has found it, he will joyfully carry it home on his

shoulders. <sup>6</sup>When he arrives, he will call together his friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' <sup>7</sup>In the same way, there is more joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God than over ninety-nine others who are righteous and haven't strayed away! ~Luke 15:3-7

Where has the summer gone?

Have you ever found yourself asking that question? It seems hard to imagine that we are at the last two weeks of our Sharing Faith discussion group and rushing towards the midway point of the season of Pentecost. Our time has been full of a lot of powerful discussions about how we can become more comfortable at sharing our faith with our family, friends and those we meet.

In the above passage from Luke, Jesus is talking to the Pharisees and scribes (the religious leader of his time) who were grumbling about Jesus eating with tax collectors and sinners. This parable is the first of three that all focus on two key themes, something that is lost and then found. The first two parables can be seen to go together with the parable of the lost sheep (vv. 3-7) and the lost coin (vv. 8-10). Verse 7 is key in helping us see Jesus' comments where He brings forth the message to his audience (Pharisees and scribes). The focus is set on the joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God. This moves it away even from the 99 who were not lost. God celebrates when one person repents and returns. The emphasis is not on the need for repentance, but on the joy of recovery.

The above passage is a great reminder for us in the church. This is also the vision of the potential second service that we will be looking at trying sometime this fall. The vision is simple but powerful. *Vision: Reaching one person for Christ.* If our congregation can provide a time and space for even one person to come to worship Christ then we have succeeded. The mission is then that it would provide a space for those who have conflicts with Sunday morning services or to reach out to those who are curious or intimidated by the formal Sunday service.

Even as time marches on this summer, many things are beginning to take shape.

Will you join us not only in praying for this new second service ministry; but, JOIN US and help us to figure out the best way to move forward at our next meeting scheduled for Saturday, August 13 at 7 pm.







Her family was safe from the war in Syria, but they didn't have access to adequate food or basic medical care.




