August 15, 2023 COUNCIL MEETING



(Please note that minutes are not approved until voted on by the council at the next meeting.)

The Church Council met on August 15, 2023, at 6:45 PM. Present were Mac Beaudry, Aaron Solomonson, Julie Bentz, Kacy Hardt, Chris Albers, Joe Sheldon (via phone) and Janet Hanson. Absent were Sarah Kadrmas, Jeff Schmidt, and Pastor Krueger. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order by President Mac Beaudry. Hanson/Hardt to approve the agenda. Carried.

Beaudry led devotions based on Isaiah 56:1, 6-8.

Melissa Rothe reported to the Council on the refurnishing of the Youth Room. They have repainted it and cleaned it out. They are looking at getting new furniture there. Rothe presented some options she had come up with. Discussion was held on where in the budget it would come out of. Since it isn't only the youth that uses that room, it was decided it should be a church expense and the youth shouldn't have to pay for it. Hanson/Bentz to allow Rothe to spend up to \$1,700.00 on chairs and tables for the Youth room and take the cost out of the facility management maintenance and repairs account. Carried.

Hardt/Albers to approve the minutes from June 8, 28, July 12 and to approve the minutes of the Congregational meeting held on Aug. 13. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$118,775.19; Building: \$202,289.43; Cemetery: \$617.40; FLY: \$12,627.37; Interest: \$12,285.57; Music: \$1,314.54; Parking Lot: \$1,520.00; Super Sunday Supper: \$4,152.43; Worship: \$2,508.44; Ameriprise Financial: \$39,995.60; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$558,078.37. Hardt/Bentz to approve the report for future audit and to pay all non-budgeted bills. Carried.

Pastor's report (Pastor Krueger): He has met with staff and various leaders of the Church. He has arranged with Rev. Dick Smith to provide shut-in and hospital visitations for the members in the Bismarck area. Pastor Krueger has/will schedule leaders to cover for him on the days he has other commitments. If there is an emergency, he has

arranged with Rev. Dennis Ristvedt to handle things until he can get here. He will be at confirmation as much as possible and has several leaders lined up to help out. He has met with the endowment fund committee and will work with the call committee. He attended the NALC Convocation in Oklahoma City with Mac and Judy Beaudry and Dean and Sonja Bergstedt.

Evangelism-Hardt reported that they are getting new bags for the young children to use during church, and they are planning a Halloween meal with the FLY group.

Property-Before the meeting all council members who could, went to the parsonage to see if any work needs to be done. Albers said that the carpets need a deep clean and the duct work should be cleaned while there isn't anyone in there. Jeannette will line up the parsonage carpet and duct work cleaning along with the Church carpet cleaning. Albers is looking at new flooring in the kitchen area in the parsonage along with the room with the fireplace.

We have \$657.92 in Thrivent Choice Dollars.

There is nothing new with the Lavern Johnson Trust money and the decorating update.

We still need one more delegate for the LCMC Convention in October.

Pastor Krueger was wondering if we are planning on a Thanksgiving Eve service. It was decided that if he is available, we will have it, but if Pastor Krueger would need to find someone to cover the service, we won't have one.

Bishop Sel bo is reel ected

The Rev. Dr. Dan Selbo was reelected as bishop of the North American Lutheran Church by delegates to the 2023 NALC Mission Convocation Aug. 9-11 in Oklahoma City.

More than 600 delegates and visitors gathered for the convocation around the theme, "Missio Dei: The Work and Mission of God." The convocation and the events preceding it comprise the NALC's biennial Lutheran Week.



Bishop Selbo received 77 percent of the votes for bishop. The Rev. Dr. David Wendel, assistant to the bishop for ministry and ecumenism, was the other nominee for bishop.

Other Elections: Julia Hartfelder of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Westerville, Ohio, and the Rev. Dr. Scott Ness, pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Fayetteville, Georgia, were elected to four-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Leslie Haines, executive director of Lutheran Military Veterans and Family Ministries in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and the Rev. Ryan Henkel, pastor of Emmons Lutheran Church in Emmons, Minnesota, were elected to the Court of Adjudication.

"On Fire for Mission" sessions made the convocation a Mission-Driven gathering. Two-hour blocks of time each day focused on domestic mission, international mission and mission related to congregational life. Dr. David Luy of the North American Lutheran Seminary opened the sessions with a reflection on Scripture, and NALC staff members provided presentations on each day's theme. Delegates then talked about the presentations and discussed ways to "take it home" to their congregations.

Six new NALC Global Workers were commissioned: Randy Stubbs in Tanzania; the Rev. Sam Chim in Cambodia; the Rev. Dr. Thomas Thorstad in Laos; the Rev. Dr. Slavomír Slávik in Slovakia; the Rev. Aleksandr Gröss in Ukraine; and Dagaga Gamechu in Kenya.

The ministry of the Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, assistant to the bishop for international mission, was celebrated. He will now be serving the NALC part time from Ethiopia and will expand his teaching and leadership ministries around the world.

Randy Stubbs, a new NALC global worker in Tanzania, and his daughters delighted delegates with their music throughout the convocation. His ministry training church musicians and pastors in Tanzania was highlighted at the convocation banquet.

The Rev. Dr. Yonas Yigezu Dibisa, president of the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, was the preacher for the closing service of Holy Communion.

A large increase in the number of candidates for ministry preparing to become NALC pastors was celebrated by the convocation.

A \$3.8 million budget was approved for the NALC for 2024. The budget anticipates spending some of the church's reserve funds. Congregations are encouraged to support the NALC with at least 5-8 percent of their regular offerings.

Today, Tomorrow & Forever 2020 Vision appeal has received \$2 million in pledges toward its \$5 million goal.

The Braaten-Benne Lectures in Theology preceded the convocation. The theme for this year's lectures was "God the Father Creates ... in His Image (Genesis 1:27)."

Other Lutheran Week events included a Faith Formation Festival, the Women of the NALC Gathering, the Lutheran Theologians for the Church Conference, the Global Confessional and Missional Forum, and a gathering of Latino church leaders from across the NALC. A variety of workshops were also offered for delegates.

NALC (North American Lutheran Church) CONVOCATION REPORTS FROM FIRST LUTHERAN'S DELEGATES

We attended the NALC Convention in Oklahoma City August 9-10-11 with Mac and Judy Beaudry. We traveled on August 8 and arrived at the Omni Hotel in time to take in a wine and cheese tasting social that evening, which gave us the opportunity to meet and visit with members of other NALC congregations. No scheduled events until 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday August 9, so the four of us visited the Oklahoma Bombing Museum. Hard to believe it happened in 1995. We had attended a LCMC Convention about 5 years ago, so it was interesting to compare convention activities. The NALC is more business centered, concentrating on financials and elections. However, the theme "Missio Dei - The Work and Mission of God" completed a six year focus on the Holy Trinity. The 2023 Convocation focused on the calling and commission we have been given in the church to share in the work and mission of God. The NALC Convocation meets every two years, so the next one will be held in 2025.

There were 467 voting delegates comprised of 222 Lay members and 245 clergy. The NALC currently has 490 congregations with 46 churches transferring in the last two years. The NALC was formed in Columbus, Ohio in 2010. They have their own seminary which currently has 47 students. They also have 130 people interested in attending the seminary.

The Rev. Danial W. Selbo from California was reelected as Bishop.

Pastor Paul Kruger also attended the convention so we were able to spend some time with him, and get to know him.

We had a wonderful meal on Thursday night at the Conference and enjoyed seeing other parts of the City on other nights. Pastor Paul introduced us to many of his colleges and they were great to dine with. They were fun and interesting. We also got to spend some time with Pastor Chuck.

The Hotel was very nice with lovely accommodations, however the entire Consortium was quite expensive.

With that we do thank you for sending us to the NALC get together. We enjoyed the breakout sessions though they were rushed. Time ran into each session. We also enjoyed the Bergstedt's and Oklahoma City.
