OCTOBER 22, 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

(Please note that minutes are not approved until voted on by the council at the next meeting.)



The Church Council met on October 22, 2023, at 1:00 PM. Present were Mac Beaudry, Aaron Solomonson, Julie Bentz, Chris Albers, Pastor Krueger, and Janet Hanson. Absent were Jeff Schmidt, Sarah Kadrmas, Joe Sheldon, and Kacy Hardt. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order by President Mac Beaudry. Albers/Solomonson to approve the agenda. Carried.

Pastor Krueger led in devotions using Psalm 150. He asked council members to share what we would praise the Lord for.

Pastor Krueger/Albers to approve the minutes from September 17, 2023. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$122,623.88; Building: \$197,156.68; Cemetery: \$717.40; FLY: \$12,711.78; Interest: \$12,467.65; Music: \$1,659.54; Parking Lot: \$1,540.00; Super Sunday Supper: \$3,504.38; Worship: \$2,508.44; Ameriprise Financial: \$39,995.60; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$556,877.75. Albers/Bentz to approve the report for future audit and to pay all non-budgeted bills. Carried.

Pastor's report: Pastor Krueger reported that "all is well". He has presided over two funerals, three baptisms, has visited the shut-in's, Confirmation classes are progressing well, and on Nov. 5, three men will be confirmed.

Committee reports: No reports except for Property: Albers reported that he contacted Carpet One about replacing the flooring in the Entry, kitchen, dining, laundry and pantry in the parsonage. Albers/Solomonson to accept the bid from Carpet One at approximately \$5,000.00, with the approval of at least one more council member who could not make it to the meeting. Carried. Other im-

provements that will need to be made at the parsonage are painting, dusting (fans, etc.), change out a couple outlets, fix towel racks, and clean up the utility room. Discussion was held and tabled on asbestos inspection. Albers will work more with Kacy and Sarah on panels in the fellowship hall.

Old Business:

We have \$755.92 in Thrivent Choice Dollars. Rost will be ordering confirmation crosses for next year.

There is nothing new with the Lavern Johnson Trust money/endowment. The executive committee will be meeting on Tuesday at 7:00 pm to discuss this.

Beaudry is still looking into the cemetery fence repair/replacement.

New Business:

The call committee will be meeting next Sunday to discuss the surveys that were handed in.

We plan to check with an Architect to see how much they would cost to come look at our Church to see about any changes we could make to utilize more space for Sunday School, etc.

The budget committee will meet before our next meeting.

Pastor Krueger/Hanson to approve the following transfers out: Charles & Stephanie Mann, Isaac and Isabella to Christ the King Lutheran Church in Evans, GA; Jill Ockhardt Blaufuss to Breckenridge Lutheran Church in Breckenridge, MN. Carried.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, November 7 at 7:00 with the budget meeting at 5:00.

Albers/Pastor to adjourn. Carried. We ended with prayer by Pastor Krueger.



First of all, I want to thank First Lutheran Church, for your past partnership and support! Currently, we are continuing with our special outreach called Vision 2033. This is the global Bible movement endeavoring to translate, record and freely provide Scripture in every language that needs it by the year 2033. **The Military Biblestick Outreach is still covered under Vision 2033.** We work in partnership with all Bible translators, including Wycliffe.

- Scripture has now been recorded in 1,894 languages, including the Tboli, spoken by 95,000 people in the Philippines.
- Gospel Films are now available in 1,365 languages, including the just released <u>Tsakhur</u>, spoken by 10,600 people in Azerbaijan.
- All of our Bible recordings and Gospel Films are available free on our Bible is app (SEE ATTACHED QR CODE).
- Once a language becomes available, then distribution and engagement programs are implemented, includ-



ing the Military BibleStick Outreach. A Marine Veteran just wrote "I was in the James A Haley VA Hospital in Tamps Fl. When I received my Bible Stick, I was seriously ill and seriously depressed and alone. My stick became my family, my friend my companion. I became an avid listener and before I knew it, I was overcome with this spirit of gratitude. Every day I thank God for the new day and the gift of life to experience it. Amen."
