NOVEMBER 7, 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

(Please note that minutes are not approved until voted on by the council at the next meeting.)



The Church Council met on November 7, 2023, at 7:00 PM. Present were Mac Beaudry, Aaron Solomonson, Julie Bentz, Kacy Hardt, Joe Sheldon, Chris Albers, Jeff Schmidt, Pastor Krueger, and Janet Hanson. Absent was Sarah Kadrmas. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order by President Mac Beaudry. Bentz/Hardt to approve the agenda. Carried.

Pastor Krueger led in devotions using Joshua 24:15.

Albers/Sheldon to approve the minutes from October 22, 2023. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$123,723.64; Building: \$197,226.68; Cemetery: \$717.40; FLY: \$12,767.78; Interest: \$12,467.65; Music: \$1,724.54; Parking Lot: \$1,555.00; Super Sunday Supper: \$3,800.33; Worship: \$2,528.44; Ameriprise Financial: \$39,995.60; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$558,499.46. Schmidt/Hardt to approve the report for future audit and to pay all nonbudgeted bills. Carried.

Pastor's report: Pastor Krueger reported that "all is well". He said we have moved ahead with the call committee and endowment committee. We had Confirmation for 3 Confirmands this past Sunday, and the other confirmation classes are going well. He presided over three baptisms and one funeral.

Committee reports:

Stewardship-No report.

Worship-Schmidt has been visiting with members and people are happy with the music and services.

Education-Kadrmas was absent, but Hardt reported on the plans for the Sunday School Christmas programs.

Evangelism-Hardt reported the Evangelism committee and FLY served a Halloween meal and served approximately 120 people. There was a lot left over with some going to the less fortunate, Lions, and Super Sunday meal.

Property-Albers reported there are some leaks

around the office and hallway. He has looked at it and will try to find the reason for it. He will continue to check on the carpet in the sanctuary. People who have looked at it think the glue has made it loose, so will look at repairs. He has picked up the dividers for the downstairs. They were going to replace the flooring in the parsonage but there needs to be more cleaning before the flooring can be put down. Albers suggested to look at a system of three people being on the property committee with rotating chairmen. Executive-No report. Mutual Ministry-No report.

Old Business: We have \$755.92 in Thrivent Choice Dollars.

The Endowment committee has met. Their recommendation is to work with Hahn Financial for the endowment. They have worked on a document and how the endowment would work. This will be finalized and asked for Council approval in December so the Council can bring it to the Congregation in January.

Beaudry is still looking into the plan for the cemetery fence project.

Randy Hanson will give a call committee report to the congregation on Sunday.

Hanson shared a letter from Ardythe Kurle saying she will continue to decorate the church until the end of the year, but then would like to pass those duties to someone else. Solomonson/Hardt to authorize the First Lutheran Church Women to oversee the decorating and the Council will reevaluate it in a year. Carried.

New Business:

We are looking at connecting with YHR Architectures to have them look at the future of First Lutheran and our building. The cost will be between \$10,000.00-\$12,000.00.

The 2024 budget will be finalized by the finance committee before our next meeting to be approved by Council before bringing it to the Congregation meeting. The Annual meeting is set for January 14, 2024, with a meal starting at 11:45 and the meeting after.

Next month we will decide where the 4th quarter benevolences will go.

Sheldon/Solomonson to approve the transfer in of Debra Gourneau from St. John's Lutheran in Underwood, ND. Carried

The next budget meeting will be on December 3 after Church. The next council meeting will be on December 5 at 6:30 pm.

Schmidt/Solomonson to adjourn the meeting. Carried.

The meeting was closed with The Lord's Prayer.



ADVENT MEANINGS

During Advent, which begins this year on December 3, many churches and families use wreaths to symbolize watchfulness and increasing joy as Christmas approaches. Colors for the candles vary, with some traditions using blue (for hope or creation) and others preferring purple (for royalty, humility or penitence).

The four candles that each represent a week in Advent also signify hope, peace, joy and love. (The third candle is often pink.) In the center is the white Christ candle, representing Jesus as the light of the world. That candle is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

The round, green Advent wreath has special meaning of its own. It symbolizes eternal life and the unending love of God, who sent his only Son to earth to die in our place.


