The Season of Lent

Wow, can Lent be starting so soon? Check your calendar, it is! Wow! So what is this thing called Lent? The history of Lent finds its roots in the early second century Christian church. These devout believers recognized the significance of Christ's resurrection and wanted a way to be prepared for the Easter Celebration. They chose the 40 day period prior to Easter as their preparation time. During this time, they gave special attention to the sufferings of Christ, evaluated their life's path in light of Christ, and often fasted and prayed.

Like those early believers, the season of Lent allows us the opportunity to gain some perspective and focus in our lives as we too give special attention to the sufferings of Jesus Christ and the wonderful forgiveness he brings.

To help facilitate this, each First Lutheran Family will receive a table-top sized cross on Sunday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, as part of this year's Lenten journey. The cross will serve as a focal point for our mid-week Lenten worship services with a series titled, *The Places of the Passion*. Each Wednesday night worshippers will receive an additional object to add to their cross that reminds them of another facet of Christ's sacrificial love.

I look forward to seeing you each Wednesday night and hope that you will take advantage of your time with God during this upcoming season of Lent.

The proposed Lenten services, "The Places of the Passion," is reflective, Lenten mid-week worship series, that takes worshippers on a journey with Jesus from "The Upper Room" to "The Cross of Golgotha" during the six weeks of Lent. Each mid-week theme finds its focus from a different portion of the Passion History, the unfolding story of Jesus suffering and death. Drawn from each of the four Gospels, a portion of Christ's passion journey is read each week, building finally toward Holy Week.

To help build the six-week focus, a family also receives a small object to take home at the close of each evening's worship service. These objects, one each week, provide a visual reminder of the events that happened in Jesus life as He endured a journey that would ultimately bring forgiveness and redemption for all mankind. Once home, these objects find their place on a wooden cross that each family receives on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday.

The Places of the Passion is a simple, devotional, mid-week service that allows believers to reflect upon Christ each week, and to take encouragement from the great work that Christ himself has done for each one of us.


The group then went over the description that Randy typed up and changes were made to it. Randy did a great job. Thanks!





#### **CROSS OF ASHES**



On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "you are dust, and to dust you shall return."




#### **GOD-SHAPED HOLE**

Blaise Pascal, a 17th-century philosopher, observed: "There is a God-shaped vacuum in the heart of each man which cannot be satisfied by any created thing but only by God the Creator, made known through Jesus Christ."

Centuries earlier, St. Augustine proclaimed "Thou has made us for thyself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in thee." And in the Old testament, the writer of Ecclesiastes expounded on the meaninglessness of earthly striving and material pursuits. Only God's Spirit can fill our emptiness and satisfy our eternal longings.

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full," says Jesus in John 10:10 (NIV). He alone provides the solution for emptiness. What comfort to be filled with —- and to find our ful-fillment in —- our Savior!





## SPRING TRAINING FOR CHRISTIANS

The word Lent comes from Middle English and German words for springtime. In light of the start of baseball season, some people call the pre-Easter season "spring training for Christians." This fresh perspective moves away from the flawed understanding that Lent must be somber, or that giving something up for Lent is punishment for sin or a way to earn God's favor.

As people of faith, we should never take a season off. But every so often — at least once a year! — we do well to examine where we need to get back in shape spiritually. Perhaps we will indeed opt to give something up: that swearing habit, sleeping in on Sundays, or the cost of a weekly treat so we can donate the money instead. Or maybe we'll take on something new for Lent: a Bible study, prayer routine or service project.

Hebrews describes spiritual discipline as challenging in the moment but yielding righteousness later. The writer urges us, "Lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees ... so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed" (12:11-13, ESV). May the spring training of Lent strengthen and heal us all.


