The Church Council met on August 12, 2024, at 6:30 PM. Present were Julie Bentz, Joe Sheldon, Sarah Rosenquist, Kacy Hardt, Pastor Krueger, Janet Hanson, Chris Albers and Alli Sheldon. Jeannette Rost was also present. Sarah Kadrmas and Aaron Solomonson were unable to attend.

President Joe Sheldon called the meeting to order. Hardt/Bentz to approve the agenda. Carried

Pastor Krueger leads devotions focusing on taste and see that the Lord is Good. Taking time to pause and realize how good God is.

Krueger/Alli Sheldon approve June 17, 2024 minutes. Motion carried.

Committee reviewed the treasurers report. 





JUNE 2025 GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP

Calling young and old to join us on a mission trip to Guatemala in June 2025! Anyone seventh grade and older is welcome (including adults)! We will have an **informational meeting on September 4**th **at 6:30 pm** to discuss cost, activities in Guatemala, fundraising opportunities, and answer questions! Guatemala expert Jill Wiess will also be available to provide more details!

Here are some basic questions and answers:

- What might we do? Building a house roughly 12 by 16 feet. Feed malnourished babies and children. Help distribute food to families in need. Hang out with school kids. Go to a lake and potentially zipline!
- What are the details? The official dates are still being set but it will be 10-12 days between June 8th and June 22nd. The cost will depend slightly on the dates and airfare but could range from \$1500 to \$2750 per person.
- How will we share Jesus with those in Guatemala? Although I don't speak Spanish, the people of Guatemala will experience Jesus' love through the actions and donations we will provide.
- What if I cannot go? How can I help?
 Prayer! We will need lots of prayer for this
 trip as well as financial and other dona tions. You can help us with fundraisers and




