Never Forgotten; Never Forsaken

"Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid or terrified ... for the Lord your God goes with you. He will never leave you nor forsake you." Deuteronomy 31:6

In the 1930's, North Dakota was one of the states hit the hardest by drought, dust storms, and grasshoppers. My grandfather once tried to help me understand just how desperate the times were. Farmers put up Russian thistle as hay to feed their cattle because nothing could grow. If you were in need, you could get feed loans from the county, but if you couldn't pay the county back, the Sheriff came out and took the livestock to pay off the loans. In 1933, there wasn't anything "green" to be seen for miles around. Dirt would blow like snow in a blizzard. Sometimes, the blowing dirt made everything so dark that kerosene lamps were even lit in the middle of the day just so a person could see.

There are times in our lives when "day gets turned into night." The messes of a sin-broken world crash into our lives and our words can so easily be, *"Lord, where are you now?*"

When the weight of the world suddenly fell upon Joshua, and God simply comes to him with a promise, "Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid or terrified ... for the Lord your God goes with you. He will never leave you nor forsake you." -- Deuteronomy 31:6

Just as these words spoke to Joshua, they speak to you and me today. They remind us that a believer in Jesus Christ is never forgotten and that you are never forsaken by God. They tell you and me, especially in our darkest moments, that we are never alone. Through every challenge, up every mountain, through every valley, in every rough place, the Lord our God goes with us!

Looking back in history, it was faith and trust in God that gave our grandfathers and grandmothers great courage and strength in times of crisis. As we read the Bible, we see that it was faith and trust in God that gave the saints of old great courage and strength as well. Isn't it also true for us? The Church Council met on September 9, 2024, at 6:30 PM. Present were Julie Bentz, Joe Sheldon, Sarah Rosenquist, Kacy Hardt, Pastor Krueger, Janet Hanson, Chris Albers, and Alli Sheldon. Jeannette Rost was also present. Aaron Solomonson was unable to attend.

President Joe Sheldon called the meeting to order. Alli Sheldon/Hardt to approve the agenda. Motion Carried

Pastor Krueger leads devotions from Luke Chapter 24.

Krueger/Albers approve old minutes. Motion carried.

Committee reviewed the treasurers report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00, Checking: \$201,745.97, Building: \$192,193.08, Cemetery: \$1,717.40; Evangelism Carnival: \$1,479.00, FLY: \$15,748.12; Interest: \$16,477.49; Music: \$2,598.33; Pizza Day: \$130.00, Raising Hope Ministry: \$90.00, Super Sunday Supper: \$5,008.80; Worship: \$2,603.44, Financial: \$39,995.60: Ameriprise Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40; Total Assets: \$641,779.63. Hardt/Bentz approve to file future audit and pay non budgeted bills. Motion carried.

- Sunday was the kickoff for the new Audio-visual system - a lot of training was completed by the volunteers - there is one more item to install it is called the Confidence Monitor.

- Confirmation will start this week on Wednesday

Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee - no report

Worship Committee - Communion assistant letter has been written and Jeannette will send this out when people are assigned to the task.

Education Committee - Krueger proposes we appoint Hardt to be interim education chair vacancy. Hardt agrees to take on this role until January and is up for the nomination for keeping this position after January. Alli Sheldon/Bentz for Hardt to move into the interim position. Motion carried

Evangelism Committee - Filling bags for the new members. Discussion for possibly recognizing new members during a service or through post card.

Property Committee - All the lights in basement were changed as well as in pastor's office, bought a chair truck which is now in the basement storage area. Jeff and Albers are going to go through items for clean-up week. Air filters in the sanctuary A/C's were cleaned out. Looking to touch up paint on the back wall in the basement and the columns in the entrance to the basement. Tricorn Audio provided us with quotes for acoustic panels - wanting \$300 a panel and around \$2000 for installation as well as shipping. This would cost approximately \$10,000. There is not room for a commercial dishwasher in the current kitchen. Will consider with future building plans. Carpet World installed carpet in the Sunday School Classrooms. They gave us an estimate for the back hallway approx. \$5,500, basement \$18,600 carpet tiles and with vinvl plank \$26,000. Discussion of having carpets cleaned more than 1x a year. Discussion to put this on the budget for next year.

picked up by Albers. A flag pole will also be placed at the Cemetery.

Installation of Pastor Paul: Council will be helping to prep and serve the meal. Hanson will be getting sandwich meat and buns as well flowers. Joe Sheldon will be apart of the service for installation.

Church Cleaning: The youth and Melissa have been assisting in cleaning areas of the church. Albers is working on getting more cleaning supplies.

New Business:

- Paragon Geophysical Services Survey of pore space around McClean County by Rainbow Energy for them to store Carbon. This is between Riverdale and Washburn. Discussion of whether we would be okay with them surveying the land. Board will wait for a land agent to contact the church.
- Architectural Expansion Committee Creating a committee to assess areas where the church would like to look at expanding before we engage an architect. Also, look at coming up with a survey for the church to make better scope to present at the annual

meeting. Looking at getting a group of 5 people together by October. Albers is willing to serve on the committee. Chad Hardt has been approached to join the committee.






