24th ANNUAL LCMC ANNUAL GATHERING REPORT SEPTEMBER 29 - OCTOBER 2, 2024 - Marion, IA Pastor Paul Krueger and Randy & Janet Hanson Attended

We would like to thank the members of First Lutheran Church for allowing us to be delegates to the 24th LCMC Annual Gathering and Convention held Sept. 29-Oct 2 in Marion, Iowa. The convention had keynote speakers, bible study, and breakout sessions on the theme, "Engaging your Cultural Moment". We started each morning with Bible study led by Gabrielle Arland. Our keynote speakers emphasized the fact that we are ambassadors of the Lord, and we must seek our own weaknesses first; but our weaknesses do not disqualify us to be a leader. We heard about Paul's approach to weakness where he does not try to hide his weakness but embraces the purpose of these weaknesses. In 2 Corinthians it says, "God's power is in our Weakness". When our weakness is admitted and God's help is requested. God's power is entrusted. We were also able to attend three different break out sessions, choosing from many topics. This was a great opportunity for us, and again we say, thank you for letting us be your delegates this year.

The theme of this year's event was "Engaging Your Cultural Moment". Elections were held for the LCMC Board of Trustees with Cindy Glessner re-elected as treasurer. Attendees also celebrated the news that as of today, the LCMC is now over 1000 congregations, including congregations in 16 foreign countries. North Dakota LCMC Congregations also met together to talk about creating an Upper Midwest LCMC District, which would include congregations in North Dakota, South Dakota, and parts of Montana. Bylaws have been prepared with action to follow soon. We are blessed to be part of an association of Lutheran Churches who remain faithful to God's Word and committed to bringing the hope of Jesus to a world in need.

24th Annual Gathering & Convention What to Know

646 people gathered together at FaithLife Church in Marion, IA from September 29 to October 2 for Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ's 24th Annual Gathering and Convention.

The theme of this year's event was "Engaging Your Cultural Moment". Through keynote speakers, worship services, and Bible studies, we explored how the cultural moments happening all around us can be seen as potential opportunities for carrying out the Great Commission.

The event opened Sunday with an opening worship service preached by Paul Hennings (FaithLife Church).

Kyle Fever (Good Shepherd Lutheran Church) took the stage as the opening keynote speaker on Monday morning, followed by a panel discussion with LCMC pastors Paul Owens (St. Paul Lutheran Church), David Christensen (Living Word Lutheran Church), Erica Varcoe (The Table Ministry), and Becky Hand (Faith Fellowship).

Morning Bible studies were led by Gabrielle Arland (Shepherd of the Valley Church).

Mike Bradley (LCMC Service Coordinator) gave his report on Monday afternoon. During this time, Dave Braun (LDA Chairperson) gave an update on the <u>Lutheran Disaster Assistance Fund</u> and awarded grants to two LCMC congregations who experienced <u>extreme flooding</u> earlier this year, and Julie Smith (LCMC Coordinator for Districts and Fellowships) announced the 2024 recipients of LCMC's newly established <u>Congregational</u> Planting Grant.

Stephen Witmer (Pepperell Christian Fellowship) served as keynote speaker on Tuesday morning.

On Tuesday afternoon, Christian Huntley (LCMC Coordinator for Leadership and Pastoral Development) recognized pastors and leaders and those who were celebrating anniversaries of ordination.

gregational Planting Grant.


